Course/Road(s) Assessed: Medbourne 20m

**Course Description:**

Start on the B664 at just outside Medbourne – heading north east towards Uppingham. Pass through Stockerston and take turn to Horninghold. Pass through Horninghold and on to Hallaton. Turn left in Hallaton towards Medbourne. Enter Medbourne and turn left towards Uppingham. Repeat circuit, to;  
Finish: c250yds before reaching Medbourne on second lap.

**Traffic Flows:**

Traffic on all roads is likely to be light.  
Traffic count well below limit.

**Course/Event History:**

Course previously used for many years with few if any incidents.

1.75 miles	Junction with side road from Blaston	Traffic turning onto course from minor road on left	Low	Warning sign on side road.
2.25 miles	Crossroads	Traffic turning onto course from minor roads on left and right	Med	Warning signs on both side roads.
3 miles	Fast, descent through sweeping left hand bend	High speed, limited visibility	Med	Warning sign for cyclists. Competitors to be encouraged to familiarise themselves with the course before riding at race speeds. Copy of Maps and RA to be available when signing on and <a href="#">accessible via club website</a>
3.5 miles	Sharp left hand bend at Stockerston	High speed descent to bend	Low	Warning sign for cyclists. Competitors to be encouraged to familiarise themselves with the course before riding at race speeds. Copy of Maps and RA to be available when signing on and <a href="#">accessible via club website</a>
4 miles	Left hand turn to Horninghold	Traffic emerging from secondary side road	Low	Warning sign for motorists on B664 past junction. Marshal in position with high visibility jacket and flag.
6 miles	Approaching village of Horninghold Several fairly tight bends and parked cars.	Traffic emerging from side road on left.	Low	Warning sign for motorists on side road. Caution sign before first bend.
7.5 miles	Left turn in Hallaton at Give Way sign	Traffic approaching junction	Low	Warning signs for motorists in both directions Marshal in position with high visibility jacket and flag.
8.5 miles	Midway between Hallaton and Medbourne	Side road on left (from Blaston)	Low	Warning sign for motorists on side road.

8.5 miles	Midway between Hallaton and Medbourne	Side road on right (from Slawston)	Low	No action required
9.5 miles	Outskirts of Medbourne	Side road on right	Low	No action required
10 miles	Centre of Medbourne	Left turn onto B664	Low	Warning sign for motorists approaching in both directions. Marshal in position with high visibility jacket and flag
10-19.5 miles	Second Lap	Riders to complete second lap of course	Low/Med	As above
19.5 miles	Approx. 250 yds before Medbourne	Finish line	Low	Warning sign for motorists. Timekeeper in position with high visibility jacket. No riders to congregate at finish line.

**NOTES:**

1. The use of a vehicle for the timekeeper(s) at start and finish is where appropriate and is only identified as an example for the action to be taken
2. The small junctions or entrances to farms/ facilities (garage, eatery, etc) that are not identified in this risk assessment have been considered, however are not considered significant to pose a risk and therefore have not been noted.
